Canadian Suncor Energy Adds Three E-ONE Fire Apparatuses to Fleet



Ocala, Fla. (DATE XX, 2016) – Suncor Energy, Canada's largest integrated energy company, has purchased three E-ONE trucks for its oil sands mining site at Fort Hills, approximately 60 miles north of its Fort McMurray facility in Alberta, Canada. The new fleet includes a Cyclone II Industrial Bronto, a Commercial Rescue Tanker, and a Cyclone II Industrial Pumper.

The Cyclone II Bronto features a 2,000 gallon per minute fire pump, Hot Shot II 150 foam system with a 300 gallon tank, and aerial controls at both the turntable and platform. "The Bronto with its 116-foot reach is critical to our infrastructure at the site," says Peter Robertson, Manager for Emergency Services as Suncor. "This truck has been set up essentially for a one-man operation. It's a pretty impressive feat of engineering."

The 3,000-gallon Rescue Tanker serves a vital role since Suncor covers a large geographical area, and a high-capacity tanker can re-supply units at a scene. The apparatus features a 1000

gallon per minute pump, a remote operated deck gun, and a Williams 1500 Around-The-Pump foam system.

Last but not least, the Cyclone II Industrial Pumper comes loaded with a four wheel drive chassis, 1200 Gallon "T" Combo Tank for water and foam, and crosslays installed into

the bumper tray for less climbing at heights and fewer risks of injury. Capable of pumping 3500 gallons per minute, the apparatus is well-suited to an industrial facility where pumping high volumes of water quickly can be critical.

"Suncor runs a full-time fire department," says Terry Planck, Industrial Sales Manager for E-ONE. He notes that Suncor Energy Emergency Services also assists in the community. In fact, when wildfire swept through Alberta in May of 2016, an E-ONE Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) unit used by Suncor for mine response assisted in the town of Fort McMurray. "Conventional firefighting methods just weren't working," Peter Robertson says. "The ARFF truck was instrumental in providing large volumes of stream great distances to support the firefighting efforts in the region."
